

*Got some extra pipes and accessories lying around the house? Or maybe you found a bunch of piping at a garage sale and just aren't sure what to do with it.*

*Well The Garage Sale Gal has just the idea:*

### *Make a plumbing pipe candelabra*



Choose the size you want to work with. For instance, you can use 1/2" around, 3/4 around, 1" around and so on. Make sure all pieces you buy will fit with the others. So, if you choose 1" around all your items must be 1".

Once you decide on the size here are the particular items you'll need. All can be purchased at hardware stores in the plumbing department.

Supplies:

Galvanized steel pipes in varying lengths, 4", 6", 8", it's up to you the length you want to go but make sure you vary the lengths.

Tees ( small pipe in shape of a T)

couplings (these are simply pipe extenders)

Elbow (small pipe with a curve)

Floor flange (this is what your candle will go in)

Caps (these will help you to "cap" off your project)

Candle tapers

Once you have all your parts begin twisting and screwing them together. Make sure they are tight as you don't want any movement especially when your candles are lit.

Make any configuration you like, it can be big or small, long or tall.

The flanges will fit on top of several of your pipes (see picture).

When you get tired of the candle holder, take it a part and make another shape. Or maybe you can use them after all in your bathroom plumbing?!
